## MHRP Scientist Scores Top Honor, Sets Sights on Long-Term Soldier, Global Health

- Dr. Trevor Crowell, a research physician with the U.S. Military HIV Research Program (MHRP), was awarded the 2019 *John Carey Young Investigator Award* on June 18, 2019.
- The award was bestowed by the AIDS Clinical Trials Group (ACTG), an organization that supports the largest network of expert HIV clinical and translational investigators and therapeutic clinical trials units in the world.
- Crowell, an infectious disease specialist, works on a number of leading-edge clinical trials designed to combat HIV infection and risk.
- Crowell's research findings have been featured in such publications as *The Lancet HIV*, *Clinical Infectious Diseases*, *AIDS*, and the *Journal of the International AIDS Society*, among others.
- MHRP is part of the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR), a subcommand of USAMRDC, and is tasked with both protecting Soldiers from HIV and improving global health by conducting research to combat HIV infection and induce long-term HIV remission.
